EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In its second year of existence, Rookie Slash has seen a huge improvement in both the quantity and quality of its program, while our core mission remains the same: to promote the integration and well-being of Geneva's refugee community through outdoor and board sports.

We are proud to say that the number of activities has increased, with 96 sessions per year. For the first time, we organized a 5-day winter camp, which strongly promoted the spirit of our sports among our regular participants. We also organized monthly sessions directly at the Bois-de-Baye refugee center for the youngest participants.

In total, we have 829 participations, with an average attendance of one session per week. One of our proudest achievements has been to welcome almost as many girls as boys in all of our sessions: **40% female participation on average!**

This year again, we carried out an impact study showing the positive impact of participants' involvement in our activities. Among other things, participants noted an improvement in their French language skills, greater self-confidence, the promotion of regular physical activities and, above all, the promotion of a sense of belonging!

While this is all very exciting, there is always room for improvement. We could, for example, emphasize the social mix of our sessions while improving our approach to recruitment and pedagogy to ensure that our program stays as inclusive as possible. Renewing our participants, while offering new opportunities to older Rookies are also new challenges that we are determined to overcome in the coming year.

Overall, 2023 has been a great year, and it would not have been possible without the extraordinary support of our team of coaches and partners. We feel very lucky to be so well surrounded.

We can't wait to shred the coming year!

BACKGROUND & CONTEXT

In 2023, Switzerland witnessed a notable increase in asylum seekers, with 30,223 individuals seeking refuge, up by 5,712 from the previous year. Additionally, there were 18,375 applications for S status submitted. Looking ahead, SEM expects around 30,000 asylum applications in 2024. which means that the number of asylum applications should continue to rise.

Over the past 3 years, there has been a significant rise in unaccompanied minor asylum seekers (RMNA), particularly in Geneva. As of November 2022, RMNA accounted for about 10% of asylum applications: **2,181 unaccompanied minors seeking asylum**

Beyond statistics and figures, it involves real people, including children. The process of integrating refugees into Swiss society presents significant challenges, especially in Geneva. Alongside practical and administrative hurdles, extreme cases of mental distress have emerged among this vulnerable population, some of whom have no support network. In 2023 alone, Geneva's refugee community reported two suicides.

We need to rethink how we welcome these flows of newcomers to our region, inclusively and positively.

As a community-focused organization, Rookie Slash is committed to addressing the unique challenges faced by refugees in Geneva.

Through mentorship programs and sports activities, we aim to cultivate a sense of belonging and empowerment, introducing our participants to positive and inclusive sporting communities.

By participating in our activities, the Rookies can connect with others, build their social network, find a sport, and overcome mental distress.

IMPACT & OUTCOME

Each year, Rookie Slash tracks the impact of its activities on participants to assess the effectiveness of its program in fostering confidence and inclusion. This year, the questionnaire was offered online to participants, and 20 surveys were anonymously filled out. The figures below are based on the collected surveys.

From 2022 to 2023, there has been a noticeable increase in preference for climbing and skiing, while skateboarding becomes the most popular sport overall. This data encourages us to continue our efforts in these three sports, while prompting us to reevaluate the appeal of water diving and slacklining, both of which are weather-dependent seasonal activities.

Comments

The trust and confidence metric evaluates participant comfort within our program. Although most responses are positive, there's a slight dip in trust toward other users, meaning outsiders of the Rookie Slash Program. We aim to address this through more mixed activities. Additionally, one negative response raises concerns about leaving participant behind. Inclusion а training should be reinforced in 2024. Overall, we are pleased to see that participants exhibit strong trust in our team members and that our our activities are boosting their self-

confidence.

This metric assesses Rookie Slash's program effectiveness in supporting participant integration. Data shows that we have created an inclusive space where they feel a strong sense of belonging. Additionally, 60% noted our sessions helped them connect with new people, and many find it valuable for improving French skills.



IMPACT & OUTCOME

Autonomy in practice

This metric evaluates participants' engagement with sports beyond our program. High engagement signals a commitment to the sports community. While 60% practice outside, mainly with friends or other Rookies, 40% do not. Efforts are needed to promote the availability of free equipment, like skateboards at Plainpalais. Increasing mixed sessions with other sports clubs could foster interaction and offer alternatives to solo practice for those who prefer company.

Conclusion

Rookie Slash's program promotes belonging and inclusion, fostering positive social connections among participants. The weekly sessions encourage openness and facilitate friendships within the community. Many new participants find the association valuable for improving their French skills. Additionally, the program boosts selfconfidence, evident through active engagement in various activities.

To improve:

- Develop tailor-made programs for older participants to ensure follow-up, adapted activities, and an opportunity to strengthen young people's leadership.
- Encourage engagement in sports outside of the program by promoting free equipment availability.
- Increase mixed sessions with other skate clubs to address concerns about trust among users and potential participants while expanding social networks and interaction opportunities.

As part of our ongoing integration efforts, Rookie Slash encourages collaboration with local communities. These partnerships contribute not only to the success of our project, but also to the integration of our participants into the local social fabric.

Our warmest thanks go to the local skateboarding community. **GVASK8**, the Geneva skateboard association, is sharing facilities with us and inviting its participants to join us at certain events. Their support has been invaluable in helping us connect with the local skate scene. We would also like to thank **TranZport Skate & SnowShop**, our trusted local skate shop, for their unwavering support. Best boards that keep Rookies rolling!

ClimbAID and its dedicated coaches have been instrumental in organizing climbing activities for our participants. We would like to thank **Planet Climbing** for providing a welcoming space for these activities.

The **Hospice Général** has been a valuable partner, facilitating collaboration and access to its reception center, as well as providing expertise in social matters. We are particularly grateful to them for sending three social educators to help us with our winter camp

We would also like to thank **ALSF** and **Genève SnowSport** for inspiring our association, and **Virage Sport** for following in Nidecker's footsteps by providing essential support in terms of winter equipment.



CHALLENGES

- 1. The Plainpalais skatepark is a vital resource for our organization, offering convenient access to skateboarding in the heart of the city. However, using this public space presents challenges:
- Risk of unwanted interactions due to the open nature of the skatepark.
- The lack of a safe indoor space for participants.
- Limited access to hygienic toilet facilities
- Insufficient storage space shared with GVASK8, exacerbated by the growing popularity of skateboarding in the city.
- 2. The absence of an indoor skatepark poses significant difficulties:
- Cancellations are frequent on rainy days due to the lack of alternative venues.
- The La Praille skatepark offers a covered option, but its location under a highway exposes participants to pollution and noise.

3. Our participant demographic is changing as our core group ages; in two years, they'll be over 18. Our programs originally focused on migrant youth aged 12 to 18, but we've extended outreach to younger kids through initiatives like those in Bois-de-Baye.

- Our challenge is to adapt by offering solutions for older participants to remain engaged
- while also welcoming new, younger members.

Program



Out of the 6 activities, we will focus on the most appreciated sports and further collaborate with local sport actors to offer opportunities for Rookies and locals to participate in activities together. This could include organizing mix sessions between Rookie Slash and local sport associations to actively encourage inclusion.

Engagement



To encourage long-term participation, we will offer ways for our participants to take responsibility in our programs, such as proposing help-coach positions to our most dedicated participants. We made a trial run by assigning responsibilities to 6 members over the different sports. However, our efforts to integrate the Rookies into their new roles and into the coaching team were undermined by a lack of a clear preparation program and clarity of roles with regard to the participants and coaches of the various sports.

Funding



While we have primarily relied on one-time grants to fund our activities in our first year, we recognize the importance of establishing longer-term partnerships to sustain our work. We will strengthen our connections with current partners and look for new organizations interested in supporting our efforts: foster the inclusion of refugees in the Canton of Geneva through outdoor and board sports. In 2023, we are thankful for the ongoing support from our longtime partners like ReCapital. We're also delighted to welcome Nidecker Snowboard Group as a new partner, who has provided both material and financial support for our mountain camp and has committed to supporting us in the coming years. Additionally, Nidecker Group introduced us to the 1% For The Planet network, which has already resulted in additional funding from corporate entities for 2024. We continue to receive support from authorities, notably through the Fond du Sport, while funding from foundations has increased in both diversity and amount. The positive financial situation and maturity of our program inspire us to continue our fundraising strategy and maintain our current partnerships with different stakeholders. Additionally, we will allocate more funds towards logistical, coordination, and development roles. This strategy aims to sustain our activities while keeping the quality of the program and expanding access to new beneficiaries.



NEXT STEPS 2024

In 2024, our program will feature: Two skate classes per week, catering to beginners and advanced riders, a weekly climbing class in partnership with ClimbAid, the return of our winter camp, welcoming up to 20 participants, spontaneous out-of-town sessions in Switzerland, monthly on-site sessions at Bois-de-baye. swimming lessons and diving during the summer. The emphasis will be on including new participants.

A new program of youth leadership will be put in place, which focuses on only two or three Rookies., among the oldest and most dedicated participant

The goal is to better accompanied the Rookies into the role of coach, respectively in climbing and skateboarding.

Ultimately, we hope to we lome the particiapnt of our Youth Leadership as coach next year.
